More recently has seen my focus move to the Local Council sector undertaking a number of part-time Clerk, Deputy Clerk and RFO roles.



COUNTY COUNCILLOR UPDATE

One of the key elements at the moment for Nottinghamshire County Council is the Local Government Reorganisation (LGR). The creation of the Unitary Authority is mandated by Central Government and is designed to replace District and County Councils with one authority and devolve more powers to the Parish Councils.

For the immediate area of Norton, Cuckney, Holbeck and Welbeck this is likely to mean no boundary or other changes. There is potential good in that services under a Unitary Authority would lose the District/County cross-over and getting things done for you might well be easier.

This is a policy started by the previous Conservative Government and continued by current central government. Your elected County Councillors have to work with this; non-engagement is not an option lest the Secretary of State just impose a plan.

In other news;

I am grateful to the Welbeck team for cutting back the shrubbery along Creswell Road. Hedges had become very overgrown and the

team responded to a request within 24 hours.

At County Council, cabinet work on the Highways Review continues and we are seeing many potholes filled. The team from VIA have been busy in the Parish and you will, have noticed extensive resurfacing along Budby Road, heading out to Thoresby, lots of work in Clumber on the through road. The A60 road markings near the Greendale Oak are also up for a refresh.

How do you have your say?

Contacting me is your first step. I may not always know the answer but it is likely that I can go to someone that does. My role is to act as a stepping stone between you and the service you require. I can guide you in the process for planning consultation, highways, schools and social care.

Sometimes the answer is that this is a 'District matter' and that must be referred to Bassetlaw District Council. However, I can and will advise on the best way to take your case forward.

WE NEED MORE POPPIES!

The Poppy Drive has been going very well but we need more! With four planned tributes to create across our villages, that adds up to a lot of poppies.

Now that the nights are drawing in and the summer heat is abating, thoughts return to our knitting needles. These are the easy knit and crochet patterns to work from. When you've finished a batch, please call me and I'll come and collect them from you.

A small group has got together to discuss the design of the tributes and how to make sure that these will stand the test of time and if you'd like to be involved in this process, please let me know.

KNIT This pattern uses standard knitting abbreviations. Tension is not important
Cast on 60 sts using 4mm needles and red DK yarn.

Rows 1–8 (K2, P2) to end.

Row 9 (K2tog) to end. [30 sts]

Row 10 (S2kpsso) to end. [10 sts]

Break off yarn, leaving a long tail. Thread tail through remaining 10 sts and pull tight, then fasten off yarn.

Join the edges of the poppy together and sew the black button in the centre of the poppy.

You can swap to black yarn on rows 9 and 10 to make the poppy look even more effective

KNIT

Colour A Red Colour B Scrap of Black or a black button

Using Col A cast on 120 stitches.

Rows 1–4 Knit

Row 5 Knit3tog across the row (40 stitches)

Rows 6–9 Knit

Row 10 Knit 2 tog across the row (20 stitches)

Rows 11–14 Knit

Row 15 Knit 2 stitches together across the row (10 stitches)

Cut yarn leaving a tail of about 20cm

Thread tail through yarn needle and slip all the remaining live stitches onto the yarn tail and pull tight. Pull around into a circle and then mattress stitch (or use whatever stitching you normally use) to seam for an invisible seam. Sew in ends.

Centre of Poppy

Using B, cast on 16 sts. Cast off. Coil into a tight spiral and sew base to the centre.

Or use a black or green button with 4 holes and sew to centre of poppy.

You can swap to black yarn from row 13 to make the poppy look even more effective



CROCHET - Any DK Yarn and 3.5mm or 4mm hook as appropriate

Black Yarn:

Ch6 and join with a ss into first ch to make a loop.

ROUND 1:

ch2 (counts as first dc) work 11dc into loop = 12 stitches

*remember if you want a larger black centre then work treble crochet instead of double crochet into the central loop.

Cast off and change to Red Yarn.

ROUND 2:

Into any stitch cast on red and ch2 (counts as 1st dc) into same stitch work 1 dc. *Work 2 dc into next stitch. *Repeat to end working 2 dc into every stitch= 24 stitches.

Join with a ss into 2nd ch you initially started with.

ROUND 3:

1st Petal. ch2 (counts as 1st dc), 2tr into next stitch, 2 tr into next stitch, 2 tr into next stitch, 2 tr into next stitch, 1dc into next st.

2nd Petal. 1 dc into next stitch, 2 tr into next stitch, 2 tr into next stitch, 2 tr into next stitch, 2 tr into next stitch, 1dc into next st.

Repeat two more times = 4 petals = 40 stitches

ROUND 4:

Into each tr stitch from previous round work 2 dc followed by a ss inbetween the two dc from previous round – Cast off
