CUCKNEY SCHOOL SPORTS DAY

Following the school's recent Sports Day, the Parish Council received a number of concerns from residents regarding traffic, parking and road safety in the village.

The Parish Council is now in contact with the school to discuss these concerns and to look at practical arrangements for future larger events. This includes better advance communication and consideration of suitable parking arrangements where these may help to reduce congestion and disruption within the village.

Our aim is simply to help ensure that similar issues do not arise again, while supporting the school in continuing to hold important events for pupils and their families.

We hope that, through good communication, cooperation and advance planning, a straightforward solution can be agreed that works well for the school, local families and residents of the wider community.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT REORGANISATION

Local government reorganisation across Nottinghamshire is going ahead, with the existing district and county councils being replaced by two new unitary authorities.

A unitary authority is a single council responsible for all local government services, replacing the current two-tier system of district and county councils.

The new Nottinghamshire Council will cover Ashfield, Bassetlaw, Mansfield, Newark and Sherwood, together with parts of Broxtowe, Gedling and Rushcliffe.

A separate Greater Nottingham Council will cover Nottingham City and the remaining parts of Broxtowe, Gedling and Rushcliffe.

For residents, nothing changes immediately. Bassetlaw District Council and Nottinghamshire County Council will continue to operate and provide local services as they do now until the new arrangements formally come into effect on 1 April 2028. Until then, residents should continue to access council services in exactly the same way as they do at present.

The District Council elections due to take place in May 2027 have been cancelled. Instead, residents will elect councillors to the new unitary authority. Those newly elected councillors will initially help prepare the new council, putting the necessary arrangements in place before it takes full responsibility for delivering services from April 2028.

Parish Council elections are still expected to take place in May 2027 as necessary.

There is still a great deal of detail to be worked through before the new system is introduced, including how local representation and decision-making will operate under the new arrangements and how the transition from the existing councils will be managed. This work will take place over the coming months. For the time being, however, residents do not need to do anything differently and the councils they currently deal with will remain in place.

As further information becomes available and the arrangements become clearer, the Parish Council will continue to keep residents informed. We will provide relevant updates through the Community Magazine and our usual Parish Council communications, particularly where there are developments which directly affect our villages or the services residents use.

COUNTY COUNCILLOR UPDATE

I hope you are all kept well during the hot weather.

The Highways team has been busy across the area. I hope you have noticed the grass cutting, verge work and roadworks taking place in Norton, Cuckney and Holbeck.

There is still much to catch up on, but we are making a real dent in the work list. Driving through Clumber and along the Ollerton Road, my suspension is finally no longer juddering!

Following public pressure and my raising illegal car racing on the A57 at Council and Cabinet, Section 59 powers are now being used. These allow police to deal with vehicles causing alarm, distress or annoyance, including seizure in appropriate circumstances. Illegal road racing is dangerous to other road users and a significant antisocial hazard. I am grateful to our local Police Inspector for being proactive in tackling this.

As Armed Forces Champion, I attended the rededication of Worksop War Memorial. It was an honour to lay a wreath on behalf of the Council alongside a local veteran's family.

Closer to home, we have installed a 'Stop the Bleed' kit in Holbeck's defibrillator cabinet and registered it on the national network. The next Parish Council-supported defibrillator will be installed in Norton's old telephone box, with a bleed kit ready to accompany it.

Our community defibrillators are a perfect example of people working together. I particularly thank Mr Dave Cuckson for his work installing the base and electrical cabinet.

Residents living close by have also offered to have their details included with the defibrillator as an emergency response resource. More on this in a future edition, but for now, a huge thank you. I am very proud to be part of, and serve, such a community.

COMMUNITY LITTER PICKS

Community litter picks are always popular and are a fantastic way of keeping our villages looking their best. Not only do they help improve the local environment, they also bring people together and give everyone the opportunity to take pride in the place we call home.

I'm pleased to say that I have recently had a very productive meeting with representatives from the Recycling and Waste Operations Teams at Bassetlaw District Council. As a result, we now have the go-ahead to organise ad-hoc community litter picks throughout the year, making it much easier for residents to get involved whenever a small group would like to help.

There are just a few important arrangements that need to be followed. If you are planning a litter pick, please email me (contact details can be found on the back page of this magazine) with your name, address and details of where and when you intend to carry out the litter pick. This information must be provided before the event so that the Parish Council can notify Bassetlaw District Council. We are required to give the Council at least five clear days' notice so that they can arrange for the collected waste to be picked up.

To help keep everyone safe, hi-vis jackets, gloves and litter pickers are available to borrow from Norton & Cuckney Village Hall. The hi-vis jackets and gloves should be worn throughout the litter pick, and we encourage everyone to use the litter pickers provided rather than handling litter directly.

Please wear sturdy footwear, such as walking shoes or boots, rather than trainers. This will provide better grip on uneven ground and greater protection from any sharp objects that may be hidden beneath grass or vegetation. For safety reasons, litter picking should also be avoided during wet weather, as rain and slippery ground can significantly increase the risk of slips and falls.

For everyone's safety, litter picking must only take place on roads with a speed limit of 30mph or less. Unfortunately, volunteers must not carry out litter picking on roads where the speed limit exceeds 30mph. If you are unsure whether a particular location is suitable, please speak to me before making arrangements. Children may take part at the discretion of their parent or carer and must be appropriately supervised at all times.

Once you have finished, please return all bags of collected litter to the pinfold at Norton & Cuckney Village Hall. Bassetlaw District Council will collect the waste from there as part of the arrangements made with the Parish Council.

Whether you're an individual, a family, a walking group or simply a few neighbours who want to make a difference, we'd love to see more people getting involved.

If you'd like to organise a litter pick, please email me—I'll be delighted to help you get started.

2026 POPPY DRIVE

Two easy patterns - one knitted, one crocheted

EASY KNITTED POPPY



You will need

Red DK yarn • black yarn or a black button • 4mm knitting needles • wool needle

Pattern

1. Cast on 60 stitches in red.
2. Rows 1-10: K2, P2 across. For a smaller poppy, work 8 rows.
3. Row 11: K2tog across - 30 stitches remain.
4. Row 12: Slip 1, K2tog, pass slipped stitch over; repeat across - 10 stitches remain.
5. Cut yarn, leaving a long tail. Thread through the remaining stitches and pull tightly.
6. Sew the side edges together to form the poppy.

Black centre

Cast on 16 stitches in black and immediately cast them off. Coil into a spiral and sew into the centre, or sew on a black button.

EASY CROCHET POPPY



You will need

Red DK yarn • black DK yarn • 4mm crochet hook • scissors • yarn needle

UK abbreviations

ch = chain • dc = double crochet • tr = treble crochet • ss = slip stitch

Black centre

Make a magic ring in black. Ch 1, work 10 dc into the ring, pull closed and ss into the first dc. Fasten off.

Red petals

Join red yarn into any stitch. For each petal work into the same stitch: (ch 2, 3 tr, ch 2, ss). Then ss into the next stitch. Repeat around to make 5 petals. Fasten off.

Even simpler option

Make the centre in red with 10 dc. Work the petal sequence into alternate stitches to make 5 petals, then sew a black button into the middle.

Handmade poppies do not need to be identical - small differences are part of their charm.

Last year, our villages looked fantastic for Remembrance, with wonderful displays of handmade poppies and soldier silhouettes. A huge amount of work was put in by residents from our villages and beyond – thank you to everyone who helped.

This year, we hope to build on that work, with an improved display in High Holbeck and more soldier silhouettes across our villages.

Please keep knitting, crocheting and felting! Red poppies are always needed and, if you have spare purple wool, please make us a few purple poppies too.

I'm very happy to collect any poppies you make.

During October, we'll be holding Knit & Natter sessions at Norton & Cuckney Village Hall to help put the displays together.

BINFORMATION

Have You Downloaded the New Bassetlaw Binformation App?

Keeping track of your household waste and recycling has become much easier with the launch of the new Bassetlaw Binformation App.

Available to download free of charge from the Apple App Store and Google Play, with a desktop version also available through the Council's website, the app brings together a range of useful waste and recycling services in one convenient place.

One of the most useful features is the app's notifications. You can choose to receive reminders telling you which bin to put out and when, helping to ensure you never miss a collection. You'll also receive notifications if there are any changes or delays to your scheduled bin collections.

The app includes:

-  Bin collection reminders – Receive notifications telling you which bin to put out and when.
-  Collection updates – Be notified of any delays or changes to your scheduled collections.
-  Address lookup – Instantly view the collection schedule for your property, including which colour bin will be emptied on which day.
-  'What Bin Does It Go In?' search – Unsure where an item belongs? Simply search for it and the app will tell you the correct bin, helping you recycle correctly first time.

-  Help and support – Report a missed bin, contact the Council's customer services team and report any issues with the app.
-  Bin It To Win It – A fun interactive game designed to improve recycling knowledge and encourage good recycling habits.

The Bassetlaw Binformation App is free, easy to use and a great way to stay up to date with your household waste and recycling collections. If you haven't already downloaded it, it's well worth having on your phone.
